Working with the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care to improve services

We continue to work closely with the MOHLTC to develop a new unit of ten psychiatric beds, an out-patient clinic, and a day treatment program for youth beyond the age of 16. This unit will enable Youthdale to offer its expertise and support to this older and presently underserved population.

Refining and expanding our tele-medicine program

In connection with Youthdale's goal to develop a consultation tool for hospitals and social agencies across Ontario, we have an agreement with the Hospital for Sick Children to jointly provide tele-medicine services.

In time, we'll be testing this tool and reviewing the efficacy of our collaboration with other institutions. Once we're satisfied with the service delivery across Ontario, we intend to offer this essential service to other provinces as well. If successful, we believe this will become an important working tool, especially in areas where psychiatric services aren't easily accessible.

Adding education opportunities to the summer camp experience

Most of the children we serve need a great deal of help integrating into the regular school system. While we have a comprehensive integration program during the school year, we believe additional support will benefit our residents. For this reason, we're allocating more time for education in the summer camp program. We began last year with enrichment in English, and this year we're adding mathematics, science, and physical education options. We've already noticed a better attitude toward school among last year's summer program participants, and some of these classes may provide additional school credits.

Evaluation of Youthdale's Mobile Crisis Service

Youthdale is committed to improving the quality of its service, and being sensitive and responsive to the diverse and changing needs of its clients and service partners. With a grant from the Ministry of Children and Youth Services, an evaluation team has just completed a comprehensive review of our Mobile Crisis Service.

There was an abundance of positive feedback on the Crisis Support team's responsiveness, knowledge, and timely support and follow-up. This was tempered, however, by a great deal of frustration with difficulties accessing crisis beds for children in urgent need, and a lack of understanding of the prioritization process for admittance.

The evaluation report contains recommendations for improving the operating efficiency and effectiveness of the service, and providing a more integrated and sustainable service network for these patients.

Expanding our service in York Region

Youthdale has collaborated with the Blue Hills Child and Family Service in a winning proposal to deliver services to children formerly served by the Thistletown Interface Program. This initiative will significantly increase Youthdale's capacity to deliver services in York Region.

The **Centre for Individual and Family Therapy** embodies Youthdale's philosophy of providing many types of therapeutic support simultaneously to meet clients' multiple needs. The Centre delivers support and counselling to Youthdale clients and their families.

Youthdale's **Urban and Rural Residential Treatment** facilities include five residential treatment houses in the greater Toronto area, and a year-round camp near Magnetawan, Ontario.

School Program Services provides five Youthdale classrooms in host local community schools for youth 11-18 from Youthdale's residential program, and local community children unable to integrate into the regular school system.

Youthdale **Crisis Services** provides emergency assistance to young people in crisis through the Mobile Crisis Support Team and the Acute Support Unit.

The **Mobile Crisis Support Team** is a multidisciplinary 24/7 team that intervenes to diffuse or stabilize youth in crisis.

The **Acute Support Unit** is a ten bed psychiatric resource which provides assessment, crisis intervention, and stabilization for youth under 16 who pose a serious danger to themselves or others.

The **Transitional Psychiatric Unit** is a ten bed in-patient facility for children under 16 who require longer-term psychiatric treatment.

Youthdale's **Intensive Support and Supervision Program** supervises youth in the community who would otherwise be sentenced to custody for criminal offences.



Other Services, Consultations, and Assessments

Youthdale Treatment Centres services and programs also include:

- psychological assessment
- medication consultation for referring physicians
- a sleep clinic which treats sleep disorders associated with other medical problems
- a teaching centre for medical, nursing, social work, and child care professionals
- a research facility focusing on advances in the treatment of childhood psychiatric disorders
